<p>To provide a sufficient level of suitable sports equipment to enable teachers to carry out high-quality PE sessions.</p>	<p>Inspection of the PE cupboards and release time for PE coordinator to check that equipment is safe and regularly audited.</p> <p>Purchase of 3 large storage containers for outside the PE cupboard to ensure equipment is kept safe and to reduce risks posed from tripping hazards.</p> <p>Purchasing of large zoom flag and pull-up banner and sports clothing for Cross Country races. The flag will be used so that the children know where the school base is during these races. Ensuring all of the children are wearing Priorslee Academy blue shirts will also help with regards to safety, as these events are very overcrowded.</p> <p>2 new football goals have been purchased for the new season. The old ones were becoming a health and safety hazard as they were starting to fall apart.</p>	<p>£2300</p>	<p>Due to the amount of equipment that has been ordered throughout the year, the storage containers have been extremely useful. They have enabled us to keep the PE cupboard a safe and tidy place.</p> <p>From a health and safety point of view, the zoom flag along with the Priorslee T-shirts have been an excellent purchase, particularly during cross country events where hundreds of people gather. It enabled the pupils of Priorslee Academy to have a base to return to, which was clear to see from a distance and through the crowds of people.</p> <p>The football goals have been in use on a daily basis at Priorslee Academy. The children used them throughout the summer term during lunch times and are frequently used by the after school club/double</p>

			touch coaching. Having these goals in place also enabled us to compete in the Years 3/4 and 5/6 football tournament where we held a number of home fixtures.

As a result of this, participation levels increased, particularly in Netball. Next year we hope to buy into the Telford and Wrekin Sports Partnership where we will have access to a much wider variety of competitions across KS1 and KS2.

Feeding back to certain individuals and giving them new ideas and tips enriched the children's learning in a range of sports. More observations will be carried out next year in order to track pupil progress and to ensure PE is being taught at a good-outstanding level.</p>
<p>To ensure that children achieve the National Curriculum expectation of being able to swim 25m confidently.</p>	<p>Provision of further opportunities for children to swim 25m with confidence, to include the hiring costs and appropriate and increase ratio of staffing for lower ability swimmers, unable to swim 25 metres confidently.</p>		<p>All of the children that found swimming difficult last year (unable to swim 25m) certainly benefitted from these sessions. They were taught a range of strokes and techniques to keep them safe in the water. We will continue to run these sessions next year.</p>
